In every year group, children have been engaged in exciting and challenging learning opportunities, and we look forward to seeing how their individual gifts and talents continue to grow over the coming year.

In terms of our faith life, we have welcomed Fr Peter to our school and parish, and he has helped to kick-start the sacramental programme for our Year 4 pupils, with a well-attended first liturgical celebration during Sunday Mass at St Mary's. Pupils across school have taken part in weekly collective worships and liturgies, and it has been great to see our prayer and reflection garden in use. Please continue to help us celebrate our whole-school and shared class Masses, and keep an eye on the weekly bulletins to see how you can be involved in our Advent preparations.

Thank you, as always, for your support in ensuring high levels of punctuality, attendance and standards of behaviour, dress and attitude to learning. We look forward to sharing a wonderful second half term with you with the lead up to Christmas, and all that brings! RIGHTS RESPECTING WEEK

This week, the pupils have been learning all about 'Rights'. As a Unicef Rights Respecting School, we are committed to teaching our pupils about their human rights, and engaging them in considering how we can all promote the rights of others — in school, local community, and indeed the wider world. In Reception class, pupils have learning what a right is, and how special all humans are; in Years 1 and 2 pupils have been learning about the variety of rights we have, and about the Convention on the Rights of the Child; in Years 3 and 4 pupils have been considering what it must be like to be a refugee, and finding out about some well-known, modern-day refugees; Years 5 and 6 have been discovering how different organisations act to try and ensure rights are met for children the world over, and the role the media play in highlighting issues facing refugees. We also welcomed two very special visitors in to school to speak to children in KS2: a gentleman who is currently awaiting official refugee status after fleeing persecution in Pakistan, and a refugee settlement officer from Gateshead Council, who has helped hundreds of asylum seekers and refugees to settle in our area. Both experiences offered our pupils a real insight in to the issues surrounding the human rights of migrants, and how we can act to ensure they are being upheld. We look forward to sharing some of our learning with you by way of an interactive school display and via the school website in the near future.
