### PARENTS’ CONSULTATIONS:

As communicated at the start of term, we will be trialling a new format for parent/carer consultations (‘parents’ evenings’) this year. Teachers will now be available throughout the day for morning, afternoon and evening appointments, which can be in person or by telephone. Pupils’ targets will be shared in advance of the meetings, and of course parents/carers will have had the opportunity to look at work in the books during our ‘explore the curriculum’ sessions. #### SPORTS UPDATES:

We have been updating you – almost weekly it seems – as to the rapid progress of the school football team through the stages of the Durham Schools FA County Competition. We are all hugely proud to report that the team were crowned county champions (for the first time in our school's history) on a night of fierce competition at Chester-Le-Street C of E School this Wednesday. The team ended the night with three wins from three games and were awarded the rather impressive Daniel O'Hare Trophy for their efforts – which we will now display proudly in our trophy cabinet for the upcoming year. The team will now go on to represent the Durham Schools FA in the North of England finals which will be held in March 2023.

It has been a remarkable start to the season, and we look forward to seeing how the team get on when they pit their talents against the best that the North has to offer!

#### REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY PARADE:

After a hiatus over recent years, the Remembrance Sunday parade and outdoor service at the cenotaph on St Mary's green will return on Sunday 13<sup>th</sup> November.

As per tradition, representatives from local schools have been asked to take part in the parade and wreath laying ceremony at the cenotaph. We know that many pupils will be in attendance with other groups and organisations (eg. Brownies, guides, cubs and scouts), but it would be lovely to have a number of pupils representing the school community on the morning. More information will be sent to those expressing an interest, but the parade will start at around 10am and will last around 1 hour. Pupils taking part in the parade will be expected to be in full school uniform and a supervising adult must be in attendance to drop-off and pick-up at arranged meeting points. Due to the nature of the event, pupils would be expected to parade and observe the outdoor ceremony respectfully, so it may not be most appropriate for some of our younger pupils. Parents should take this into consideration as only school staff and pupils themselves may participate in the parade.
