



SCHOOL UPDATES

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION:

A wonderfully spiritual and moving celebration of the Eucharist was shared by all present last Saturday, as 30 of our young people received the Sacrament of Holy Communion for the first time. A huge thank you must go to all who helped to prepare the children in any way for the celebration, in particular the families present, as well as Mrs McTernan and our parish Catechists, who have lead the sacramental preparation programme this year. We look forward to sharing in the continued active participation of these pupils in the Church, and extend a universal welcome to attend Mass at St Mary's RC Church at 9:30am every Sunday, and in so doing, continue to support each child on their own faith journey.

MUSIC SHOWCASE – TICKETS:

Thank you for returning your request slips for tickets to this year's Musical Showcase. As we have now received all orders, we will allocate tickets as per the pre-explained procedure next week. Following this, a note will go out to parents that tickets can be collected and paid for at the school office; we will also then put any spare tickets up for general sale.

Year 6 parents will also be participating in the event with their weekly cake stall – please be generous – and pupils who need to leave at 3:15pm can of course do so.

POETRY COMPETITION:

A huge well done to Alexa and Michael in Year 5 who competed this week in a cluster poetry competition held at St Philip's school. The pupils, who as part of the National Curriculum are called to learn various forms of verse off by heart, performed two chosen poems to a panel made up of teachers from competing schools as well as a local poet/author. Both pupils performed their chosen pieces incredibly well – so much so that Alexa was crowned overall champion for 2017! Well done to both pupils for their attitude and commitment to this project, and for representing the school so wonderfully!

DIOCESAN PRIMARY FESTIVAL:

This week, Year 6 spent a somewhat wet, but certainly inspiring, day of worship, reflection and retreat – along with other Year 6 pupils from across the Diocese – led by the Youth Ministry Team at the Emmaus Village in Consett. The pupils threw themselves in to the day, which focused on the theme: ‘Razed’; throughout the day, the congregation was challenged to consider the challenges we all face to do what’s right and just in our lives, and how to let God’s light be seen in what we do and say. REMINDERS

SUPERVISION BEFORE AND AFTER SCHOOL:

A polite reminder to parents/carers dropping off/picking up pupils before and at the end of the school day, that pupils must be kept under close supervision. We have received reports of a number of incidences in which pupils are putting themselves or others at risk (eg. pupils climbing fencing; pupils removing large sticks and logs from the Forest School area; pupils swinging on football posts). Whereas we enjoy and encourage the social aspect of ‘the yard’, and do not wish to ever ‘chase’ families away from school (!!), we would advise close supervision of children and regular reinforcement of what is/isn’t allowed on school grounds from parents/carers.
