Firstly, on Wednesday, following a very successful season, Mrs Joyce's Y5/6 Netball teams battled to 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> place respectively in a tournament held at St Thomas More displaying amazing skill, determination and fair play along the way.

On Thursday, we took 8 pupils from Y5 to take part in an afternoon of lawn bowls and Lyndhurst Bowling Club. Despite the sport being brand new, the pupils had an amazing afternoon in the sun, and even brought home gold medals, as well as a beautiful salver and signed England shirt for our trophy cabinet which were presented by Commonwealth bronze medalist David Bolt – who spent the afternoon coaching and encouraging the pupils.

We then hosted the Semi-finals of the Northern Cross girls' football tournament on a wonderful, sunny Thursday evening. The St Mary's girls faced tough competition from three other teams: St James' (Jarrow), St Matthew's (Jarrow) and Our Lady of the Rosary (Peterlee), but after some wonderful football, eventually qualified alongside St Matthew's for the finals to be held in a week's time.

We capped off this wonderful week of sport by taking 20 pupils from KS2 to participate in the Gateshead Athletics Festival, held annually at the International Stadium. The pupils – once again – represented the school admirably demonstrating amazing talent, resilience and respect, and everyone involved had a thoroughly enjoyable day.
