## Our Curriculum:



At St Mary's, we strive to offer a broad and balanced Curriculum, based on firm groundings, which inspires, motivates and supports, and is delivered by highly skilled Teachers and support staff. The principles of the St Mary's Curriculum are as follows:



## Curriculum Subjects:

Our Core Curriculum consists of Religious Education, English (Reading, Writing – including Phonics, and Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling), Mathematics and Science. Alongside this, pupils will access a Foundation Curriculum based on half-termly topics, in Humanities (History and Geography), Computing, Art and Design Technology, Music, Computing, Physical Education and Languages. Each Term, parents/carers will receive a Curriculum overview of the key learning objectives in each curriculum area.

## Extended Learning Opportunities:

Alongside our Core and Foundation Curriculum, pupils will access a rich wider range of learning opportunities which we call our Extended Learning Opportunities. These centre on the key areas of: Information and Communication Technology, Arts and Culture, Global Citizenship and the Rights Respecting Agenda, Outdoor Learning, Sport and Exercise. You will see these outlined in each class' termly Curriculum Map.

## Routines for Year 5:



As children move into Upper Key Stage 2, a focus is placed on children taking greater responsibility for remembering the belongings that they need for each day independently. Please try to encourage your child to remember such things themselves. If for whatever reason your child does not bring home a homework task which has been set or any communication from school (such as newsletters), spare copies are kept in the classroom for the children to retrieve themselves.

### Homework

Homework will be sent home weekly on a **Thursday** to be returned on a **Monday** alongside your child's blue bag. Homework will usually be one piece of Maths and one piece of English related to either learning from the past week or a focus on key ongoing skills (such as multiplication and division facts or reading comprehension). On occasion, Maths or English homework may be replaced by a Science or Humanities (History/ Geography) task.

### Spellings

Spellings will be sent home alongside homework every **Thursday**, each week focusing on a different spelling rule from the Year 5 and 6 Programme of Study. This list will contain some potentially helpful strategies and information to aid the learning of the spelling rule – please only use this if it is helpful! The list will also contain the date of the spelling test for that list.

### Reading diaries

All children will have a Reading Diary to be completed and signed. Please encourage your child to read regularly and bring their reading diary in on a **Thursday**. These will be checked and those who read regularly will be rewarded.

### PE

PE will take place on both a **Thursday** afternoon and a **Friday** morning. Children will need full PE kit in school on both days (including trainers).

# What's Special in Year 5:



## Buddies

In Year 5, we have a special role to play in welcoming our new Reception class to our school family as 'Buddies'. Each child in Reception is paired with a child from Year 5 to help them to transition and settle into the routines of school. Year 5 children help their Buddies in a variety of ways from lining up with them on the yard to sitting with them in Church. In addition, throughout the school year, there will be many additional opportunities to engage with Buddies in activities outside of the regular school day such as Christmas performances and special masses.

## Cycling Generation – Coast to Coast

Ben Tweedie, from Cycling Generation, will be working closely with pupils in Year 5 on a very special project this year. In June, interested pupils, parents and carers from our Year 5 class, will be offered the opportunity to participate in a four day 'Coast to Coast' ride. Pupils and parents/carers involved will be asked to commit to a weekly club in preparation for the ride, which Ben will run alongside school staff also taking part.
